### **ARBITRATOR and MEDIATOR**

I am a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators and the College of Commercial Arbitrators who has been selected to serve on Tribunals resolving international disputes under the auspices of the International Centre for Dispute Resolution (ICDR), the International Chamber of Commerce (ICC), and other major providers of dispute resolution services. With more than two decades of experience as an arbitrator evaluating and ruling in complex transactional and commercial matters, I was the first woman selected to the International Bar Association's *Who's Who Legal: Texas* (print edition 2008) under "Arbitration," which described me as "a 'very fine practitioner' in the eyes of her peers. Recognised for her work as both arbitrator and counsel, she was commended across a range of sectors including commercial, health care, corporate and employment matters..." I have represented parties in international disputes and international business transactions since the late 1980s. I recognize the significant differences between application of the American approach to discovery and presentation of evidence and the approach to discovery and presentation of evidence more commonly employed in international arbitration. I have authored materials and spoken on ADR processes for the American Arbitration Association, the State Bar of Texas, the International Institute for Conflict Prevention & Resolution (CPR), and West Services (a Thomson Reuters company).
